

CARIBBEAN CACHET



hristophe Harbour in St Kitts is an exceptional 2,500-acre residential resort that reflects its pristine location on what developer Charles 'Buddy' Darby calls 'the thin end of the drumstick'. With Kiawah Island in South Carolina and The Lodge at Doonbeg in Ireland under his belt, Buddy believes 'affluent people want to be part of a community.' This one provides a mix of 'legacy' home sites from \$700,000 to \$8.5 million (build costs from circa \$650 per sq ft); custom-built houses from \$3.7 million; turnkey villas from \$1.375 million; and fractional ownership four-bedroom residences from \$450,000 for

a 1/10 deeded share. Alternatively, if you're down to your last superyacht, freehold marina berths start from \$1.875 million for 150-foot-plus vessels and rise to \$5.9 million for their 300-foot custom-built counterparts. This is very much a destination marina village with its colonial-style customs house, crew lounge and fitness centre, restaurants, bars and boutiques. 'That it also offers berth owners freehold titles makes Christophe Harbour a unique proposition,' says director of yachting (and Buddy's former superyacht captain) Aeneas Hollins. 'Our cruising grounds benefit from the longest leeward windy stretch in the Caribbean; you can sail

here, at speed, with a glass of champagne in your hand, no problem.' St Kitts completes the 55-mile cruising triangle between Antigua and St Maarten.

In the Grenadines, Mandarin Oriental has taken the helm at Canouan's Pink Sands Club, with its championship golf course, spa and children's club. Three-, four- and five-bedroom villas in this private 1,200-acre gated community start from \$6 million through Savills. In Barbados, Savills and Knight Frank are instructed on the island's swankiest development to date. The Villas at Beachlands start from \$28 million, and are set in 4.5-acre grounds with 700 feet of
